# Top Cop's Rule



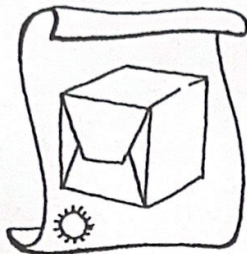
